Horse Riding in City Limits Prohibited

At their regular meeting held on Monday, April 28th, Mansfield's Board of Alderman, adopted a local Ordinance regarding the riding of horses within the corporate limits of the City of Mansfield. The full Ordinance was published in the May 8th edition of *The Enterprise*, with a certified original on file at Mansfield City Hall. The Ordinance is currently in effect, and specifies that it shall be unlawful, at any time of the day or night, to ride, drive or lead horses, ponies, mules, donkeys, cows, or to drive carriages or wagons drawn by such animals, upon any public property, public street, sidewalk or alleyway located within the city limits. The only exception to this new law would be where permission has been granted by the City to ride such animals in a parade, a carnival, a festival or some similar event. This Ordinance will be strictly enforced. Anyone who violates the provisions of this Ordinance will be subject to a fine of up to \$300.00, jail of up to sixty (60) days, or both. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this new, local law are repealed.
